

Six years ago, Carewest established a set of principles called 'building blocks.' These building blocks form the basis of care and service delivery for how we work as an organization. For example, rather than departments, we work in teams as part of Programs (Capable Seniors, Supportive Pathways and Equal). We are also 'customer driven' which means the needs of our residents and clients are the focus for everything we do.

During the last six years, Carewest has changed a great deal. While our 'program based' way of delivering services works well for Carewest, we need to do some modifications so it remains the right fitnow and into the future.

As a result of considerable input during the past six months from Carewest staff and management, we have refined the structure of the long term care component of our organization. Each of the Site Leaders will explain these changes in greater detail in the next few weeks.

Without making changes to how we deliver care at the bedside, we needed to provide a different kind of support to the Program Leaders so they can devote more of their time and attention to clinical practice.

I am pleased with these improvements because they will respond to most of the issues that were identified by many staff such as scope and workloads. Improvements will also benefit our clinical programs and allow for greater flexibility to respond to changing needs. The implementation itself will be phased in; we expect to have everything in place by this Fall.

In addition, we have also re-organized our education structure – with a great deal of help from our Education Coordinators. Your Site Leaders will inform you of the details in the very near future.

On behalf of the Carewest Board, I would like to extend my sincere appreciation to all those who have been involved. This was an enormous amount of effort!

New Continence Clinic

Many believe that urinary incontinence is an untreatable problem that goes along with getting older. Fortunately, this is not true. Assessment and treatment can help individuals regain complete or social continence and greatly improve their quality of life.

Day Hospital has opened a pilot Continence Clinic providing assessment and treatment services and referrals to specialists when needed. The Day Hospital RNs, Alison Mitchell and Shirley Cox, are excited about initiating these services.

Anyone can be referred to the clinic, including clients themselves, family members or health care providers. Eligible clients should:

- have a valid Personal Health Number;
- be cognitively intact, or have a caregiver who is able to carry out recommended interventions;
- be able to arrange transportation and attend clinic appointments;
- be 55 years of age or older; and
- be living in the community.

The clinic will be open Wednesday afternoons at Carewest Dr. Vernon Fanning Centre (in the Seating Clinic area) from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Many thanks to the Seating Clinic team for giving us space for this pilot project.

The Palliative Care Volunteer Program at Carewest



The Palliative Care volunteer program is a vital and growing part of Carewest. Based on the philosophy 'To cure sometimes, to relieve often, to comfort always', the Palliative Care Program started 15 years ago and continues to have a positive impact on countless Carewest residents.

Volunteers are a critical part of the Palliative Care program at Carewest. The goal of Palliative Care is to make sure residents with serious illnesses and end-of-life issues have the best quality of life. This would not be possible without our Palliative Care volunteers.

There are currently 30 dedicated volunteers working throughout Carewest. More caring hearts however are always needed and welcome.

Palliative Care volunteers have two important roles: One-to-one visitation and Crisis Sitting. A one-to-one visitation is set-up when a resident is struggling with issues around grief and loss. These feelings of loss may be the result of leaving a home or position in the community or from needing more care. Crisis Sitting happens when a resident is nearing the end of life. Volunteers provide a listening ear and a hand to hold so the resident is not alone.

Becoming a Palliative Care Volunteer:

When someone is interested in volunteering we schedule an interview and site tour. During the interview, we introduce them to the Palliative Care program and the valuable role of volunteers. A screening process is undertaken to determine whether the volunteer is suitable for the program. Before the volunteer is placed, we provide indepth palliative care training to ensure the volunteer experience is beneficial for both residents and volunteers. Periodic volunteer meetings offer peer support.

Colonel Belcher Care Centre News

(New Project Development)

Plans are moving forward to transfer operations of the Colonel Belcher Veterans' Care Centre (CBVCC) to Carewest.
September 2001 is the target time for Carewest to become the new employer.

Blair Phillips, Carewest Service Leader Human Resources and Brenda Ward, Manager, Human Resource CBVCC/CRHA have hosted fourteen information sessions (for all CBVCC staff working groups) to answer questions about the transition. Both Blair and Brenda report that the meetings were positive with plenty of questions and discussion.

Many Colonel Belcher staff members have toured and job shadowed to learn about Carewest. Their reactions have been quite positive, particularly concerning our team work and pleasant surroundings.

On April 18, 2001, members of the CBVCC and Carewest leadership teams had an opportunity to introduce themselves. They talked about how communication would take place, clear expectations, personal leadership styles and some guidelines for working together.

Mike Burke, Director of Support Services (CRHA), his support team, Mary Sangha, Administrative Leader CBVCC and members of the Carewest Leadership team met face to face for the first time on April 11, 2001. 
