This position will work with the manager to support site based capacity to address IPC practices and application of Clinical standards to provide exceptional care to Carewest residents and clients. Responsible for other related duties as required. The position will also provide support for the quality and safety agenda through safety investigations and other clinical quality related projects.

### Qualifications:

- Graduation from a recognized nursing program; Bachelor's Degree in Nursing required
- Registration with the CARNA required. Certification in Infection Control (CIC) preferred.
