Accessing “Open Access Journals”

1. Type “open access journals” on your browser bar (Google, Google Chrome, Safari, etc.)
2. Select “TOP OPEN ACCESS JOURNALS/PEER REVIEWED ... - OMICS International
3. Select “Journals by Subject” or “Clinical and Medical Journals”
4. Select “Journal Name” from the list on the left
5. Type “your search term” (e.g. frontotemporal dementia) in the “Search Bar” on the right
6. Select from the articles appearing
